ANNEX I - INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

A. Introduction

1. General

The purpose of this RFP is to obtain the technical and financial offers from Eligible Bidders for **the provision of FINANCIAL AUDIT OF THE MGo956.01 – “YES – Youth Environmental ClubS to mobilize children and communities toward sustainable development in Madagascar”**, as per the attached Terms of Reference (TOR), Annex III.

2. Cost of proposal

The bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of the Proposal, WWF will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the solicitation.

B. Proposal Documents

3. Contents of proposal documents

Proposals must offer services for the total requirement. Proposals offering only part of the requirement will be rejected. The Bidder is expected to examine all corresponding instructions, forms, terms and specifications contained in the Solicitation Documents. Failure to comply with these documents will be at the Bidder's risk and may affect the evaluation of the Proposal.

4. Amendments of proposal documents

At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Proposals, WWF may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder, modify the Solicitation Documents by amendment.

All prospective Bidders that have received the Solicitation Documents will be notified in writing of all amendments to the Solicitation Documents.

In order to afford prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take the amendments into account in preparing their offers, WWF may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Proposals.

C. Preparation of Proposals

5. Language of the proposal



The Proposals prepared by the Bidder and all correspondence and documents relating to the Proposal exchanged by the Bidder and the procuring WWF entity shall be written in the **English** language.

6. Documents comprising the proposal

The Proposal shall comprise the following components:

- (a) Proposal submission form:
- (b) Operational and technical part of the Proposal, including documentation to demonstrate that the Bidder meets all requirements;
- (c) The financial proposal: completed in accordance with clauses 7,8 and 9.

7. Proposal form

The Bidder shall structure the operational and technical part of its Proposal as follows:

- (a) Management plan - Organization of the mission.

This section should provide corporate orientation to include the year and state/country of incorporation and a brief description of the Bidder's present activities. It should focus on services related to the Proposal.

This section should also describe the organizational unit(s) that will become responsible for the contract, and the general management approach towards a project of this kind. The Bidder should comment on its experience in similar projects and identify the person(s) representing the Bidder in any future dealing with the procuring WWF entity.

- (b) Resource plan

This should fully explain the Bidder's resources in terms of personnel and facilities necessary for the performance of this requirement. (the list and CVs of the team members).

- (c) The methodological approach.

This section should demonstrate the Bidder's responsiveness to the specification by identifying the specific components proposed, addressing the requirements, as specified, point by point; providing a detailed description of the essential performance characteristics proposed warranty; and demonstrating how the proposed methodology meets or exceeds the specifications.



(d) The timing of intervention.

The operational and technical part of the Proposal should not contain any pricing information whatsoever on the services offered. Pricing information shall be separated and only contained in the appropriate **financial proposal**.

Information which the Bidder considers proprietary, if any, should be clearly marked “proprietary” next to the relevant part of the text and it will then be treated as such accordingly.

8. Financial Proposal

The financial proposal defining separately the fees from the refundable expenses, as well as identifying the VAT included and excluded amounts.

Refundable expenses must be justified and should not exceed WWF’s rates. Otherwise, WWF may revise the rates of refundable expenses.

9. Proposal currencies

All prices shall be quoted in Ariary (MGA) only.

10. Period of validity of proposals

Proposals shall remain valid for sixty (60) days after the date of Proposal submission prescribed by the procuring WWF entity, pursuant to the deadline clause. A Proposal valid for a shorter period may be rejected by the procuring WWF entity on the grounds that it is non-responsive.

In exceptional circumstances, the procuring WWF entity may solicit the Bidder’s consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the responses thereto shall be made in writing. A Bidder granting the request will not be required nor permitted to modify its Proposal.

11. Format and signing of proposals

The Proposal shall be signed by the Bidder or a person or persons duly authorized to bind the Bidder to the contract.

A Proposal shall contain no interlineations, erasures, or overwriting except, as necessary to correct errors made by the Bidder, in which case such corrections shall be initialed by the person or persons signing the Proposal.



12. Payment

WWF shall effect payments to the Contractor after acceptance by WWF of the invoices submitted by the contractor, upon achievement of the corresponding milestones.

D. Submission of Proposals

13. Sealing and marking of proposals

The Bidder shall seal the Proposal in one outer and two inner envelopes, as detailed below.

(b) Both inner envelopes shall indicate the name and address of the Bidder. The first inner envelope shall contain the information specified in Clause 8 (*Proposal form*) above, with the copies duly marked “Original” and “Copy”. The second inner envelope shall include the Financial Proposal duly identified as such.

Note, if the inner envelopes are not sealed and marked as per the instructions in this clause, the procuring WWF entity will not assume responsibility for the Proposal’s misplacement or premature opening.

14. Deadline for submission of proposals

Proposals must be received by the procuring WWF entity at the address specified under clause *Sealing and marking of Proposals* **no later than January 13, 2013 at 17H00 local time.**

15. Late Proposals

Any Proposal received by the WWF after the deadline for submission of proposals, pursuant to clause *Deadline for the submission of proposals*, will be rejected.

16. Modification and withdrawal of Proposals

The Bidder may withdraw its Proposal after the Proposal’s submission, provided that written notice of the withdrawal is received by WWF MWIOPO prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of Proposals.



The Bidder's withdrawal notice shall be prepared, sealed, marked, and dispatched in accordance with the provisions of clause Deadline for Submission of Proposals. The withdrawal notice may also be sent by email or fax but followed by a signed confirmation copy.

No Proposal may be modified subsequent to the deadline for submission of proposals.

No Proposal may be withdrawn after the deadline for submission of proposals and the expiration of the period of proposal validity specified by the Bidder on the Proposal Submission Form.

E. Opening and Evaluation of Proposals

17. Opening of proposals

The procuring entity will open the Proposals in the presence of a Committee formed by the Regional Representative -WWF MWIOPO.

18. Clarification of proposals

To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Proposals, the Purchaser may at its discretion, ask the Bidder for clarification of its Proposal. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in fees or substance of the Proposal shall be sought, offered or permitted.

19. Preliminary examination

The Purchaser will examine the Proposals to determine whether they are complete, whether any computational errors have been made, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Proposals are generally in order.

Arithmetical errors will be rectified on the following basis: If there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price shall prevail and the total price shall be corrected. If the Bidder does not accept the correction of errors, its Proposal will be rejected. If there is a discrepancy between words and figures the amount in words will prevail.

Prior to the detailed evaluation, the Purchaser will determine the substantial responsiveness of each Proposal to the Request for Proposals (RFP). For purposes of these Clauses, a substantially responsive Proposal is one which conforms to all the terms and conditions of the RFP without material deviations. The Purchaser's determination of a Proposal's responsiveness is based on the contents of the Proposal itself without recourse to extrinsic evidence.

A Proposal determined as not substantially responsive will be rejected by the Purchaser and may not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the non-conformity.



20. Evaluation and comparison of proposals

A two-stage procedure is utilized in evaluating the proposals, with evaluation of the technical proposal being completed prior to any price proposal being opened and compared. The price proposal of the Proposals will be opened only for submissions that passed the minimum technical score of 70% of the obtainable score of 100 points in the evaluation of the technical proposals.

The technical proposal is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Terms of Reference (TOR) and in accordance with the following technical evaluation criteria.

In the Second Stage, the price proposal of all contractors, who have attained minimum 70% score in the technical evaluation will be opened and subsequently compared.

The Bidder presenting the lowest bid will be selected.



F. Award of Contract

21. Award criteria, award of contract

WWF MWIOPO reserves the right to accept or reject any Proposal, and to annul the solicitation process and reject all Proposals at any time prior to award of contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected Bidder or any obligation to inform the affected Bidder or Bidders of the grounds for the Purchaser's action

Prior to expiration of the period of proposal validity, WWF MWIOPO will award the contract to the qualified Bidder whose Proposal after being evaluated is considered to be the most responsive to the needs of the organization and activity concerned.

22. Notification

The Bidder whose tender has been accepted shall be informed as soon as possible and no later than during the period of time when the tender is binding for the Bidder. Bidders whose tenders have not been accepted shall be informed of this as soon as possible.

23. Signing of the contract

Within **one (1) week** of receipt of the contract the successful Bidder shall sign and date the contract and return it to the Purchaser.



ANNEX II - GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. LEGAL STATUS

The Contractor shall be considered as having the legal status of an independent contractor vis-à-vis WWF MWIOP. The Contractor's personnel and sub-contractors shall not be considered in any respect as being the employees or agents of WWF MWIOP.

2. SOURCE OF INSTRUCTIONS

The Contractor shall neither seek nor accept instructions from any authority external to WWF MWIOP in connection with the performance of its services under this Contract. The Contractor shall refrain from any action which may adversely affect WWF MWIOP and shall fulfill its commitments with the fullest regard to the interests of WWF MWIOP.

3. CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR EMPLOYEES

The Contractor shall be responsible for the professional and technical competence of its employees and will select, for work under this Contract, reliable individuals who will perform effectively in the implementation of this Contract, respect the local customs, and conform to a high standard of moral and ethical conduct.

4. ASSIGNMENT

The Contractor shall not assign, transfer, pledge or make other disposition of this Contract or any part thereof, or any of the Contractor's rights, claims or obligations under this Contract except with the prior written consent of WWF MWIOP.

5. SUB-CONTRACTING

In the event the Contractor requires the services of sub-contractors, the Contractor shall obtain the prior written approval and clearance of WWF MWIOP for all sub-contractors. The approval of WWF MWIOP of a sub-contractor shall not relieve the Contractor of any of its obligations under this Contract. The terms of any sub-contract shall be subject to and conform to the provisions of this Contract.

6. OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT

The Contractor warrants that no official of WWF MWIOP has received or will be offered by the Contractor any direct or indirect benefit arising from this Contract or the award thereof. The Contractor agrees that breach of this provision is a breach of an essential term of this Contract.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor shall indemnify, hold and save harmless, and defend, at its own expense, WWF MWIOP, its officials, agents, servants and employees from and against all suits, claims, demands, and liability of any nature or kind, including their costs and expenses, arising out of acts or omissions of the Contractor, or the Contractor's employees, officers, agents or sub-contractors, in the performance of this Contract. This provision shall extend, inter alia, to claims and liability in the nature of



workmen's compensation, products liability and liability arising out of the use of patented inventions or devices, copyrighted material or other intellectual property by the Contractor, its employees, officers, agents, servants or sub-contractors. The obligations under this Article do not lapse upon termination of this Contract.

8. INSURANCE AND LIABILITIES TO THIRD PARTIES

The Contractor shall provide and thereafter maintain insurance against all risks in respect of its property and any equipment used for the execution of this Contract.

The Contractor shall provide and thereafter maintain all appropriate workmen's compensation insurance, or its equivalent, with respect to its employees to cover claims for personal injury or death in connection with this Contract.

The Contractor shall also provide and thereafter maintain liability insurance in an adequate amount to cover third party claims for death or bodily injury, or loss of or damage to property, arising from or in connection with the provision of services under this Contract or the operation of any vehicles, boats, airplanes or other equipment owned or leased by the Contractor or its agents, servants, employees or sub-contractors performing work or services in connection with this Contract.

9. COPYRIGHT, PATENTS AND OTHER PROPRIETARY RIGHTS

WWF MWIOPO shall be entitled to all intellectual property and other proprietary rights including but not limited to patents, copyrights, and trademarks, with regard to products, or documents and other materials which bear a direct relation to or are produced or prepared or collected in consequence of or in the course of the execution of this Contract. At the WWF MWIOPO's request, the Contractor shall take all necessary steps, execute all necessary documents and generally assist in securing such proprietary rights and transferring them to WWF MWIOPO in compliance with the requirements of the applicable law.

10. USE OF NAME, EMBLEM OR OFFICIAL SEAL OF WWF MWIOPO

The Contractor shall not advertise or otherwise make public the fact that it is a Contractor with WWF nor shall the Contractor, in any manner whatsoever use the name, emblem or official seal of WWF MWIOPO, or any abbreviation of the name of WWF-MWIOPO with its business or otherwise.

11. CONFIDENTIAL NATURE OF DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION

All maps, drawings, photographs, mosaics, plans, reports, recommendations, estimates, documents and all other data compiled by or received by the Contractor under this Contract shall be the property of WWF MWIOPO, shall be treated as confidential and shall be delivered only to WWF MWIOPO authorized officials on completion of work under this Contract.

The Contractor may not communicate at any time to any other person, Government or authority external to WWF MWIOPO, any information known to it by reason of its association with WWF MWIOPO which has not been made public except with the authorization of WWF MWIOPO ; nor shall the Contractor at any time use such



information to private advantage. These obligations do not lapse upon termination of this Contract.

12. FORCE MAJEURE; OTHER CHANGES IN CONDITIONS

Force majeure, as used in this Article, means war (whether declared or not), invasion, revolution, insurrection, or other acts of a similar nature or force which are beyond the control of the Parties.

In the event of and as soon as possible after the occurrence of any cause constituting force majeure, the Contractor shall give notice and full particulars in writing to WWF MWIOPPO, of such occurrence or change if the Contractor is thereby rendered unable, wholly or in part, to perform its obligations and meet its responsibilities under this Contract. The Contractor shall also notify WWF MWIOPPO of any other changes in conditions or the occurrence of any event which interferes or threatens to interfere with its performance of this Contract. The notice shall include steps proposed by the Contractor to be taken including any reasonable alternative means for performance that is not prevented by force majeure. On receipt of the notice required under this Article, WWF MWIOPPO shall take such action as, in its sole discretion; it considers being appropriate or necessary in the circumstances, including the granting to the Contractor of a reasonable extension of time in which to perform its obligations under this Contract.

If the Contractor is rendered permanently unable, wholly, or in part, by reason of force majeure to perform its obligations and meet its responsibilities under this Contract, WWF MWIOPPO shall have the right to suspend or terminate this Contract on the same terms and conditions as are provided for in Article 15, "Termination", except that the period of notice shall be seven (7) days instead of thirty (30) days.

13. TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this Contract for cause, in whole or in part, upon (30) thirty days' notice, in writing, to the other party. The initiation of arbitral proceedings in accordance with Article 16 "Settlement of Disputes" below shall not be deemed a termination of this Contract.

WWF MWIOPPO reserves the right to terminate without cause this Contract at any time upon 10 days prior written notice to the Contractor, in which case WWF MWIOPPO shall reimburse the Contractor for all reasonable costs incurred by the Contractor prior to receipt of the notice of termination.

In the event of any termination by WWF MWIOPPO under this Article, no payment shall be due from WWF MWIOPPO to the Contractor except for work and services satisfactorily performed in conformity with the express terms of this Contract. The Contractor shall take immediate steps to terminate the work and services in a prompt and orderly manner and to minimize losses and further expenditures.



Should the Contractor be adjudged bankrupt, or be liquidated or become insolvent, or should the Contractor make an assignment for the benefit of its creditors, or should a Receiver be appointed on account of the insolvency of the Contractor, WWF MWIOPO may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy it may have, terminate this Contract forthwith. The Contractor shall immediately inform WWF MWIOPO of the occurrence of any of the above events.

14. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

Amicable Settlement

The Parties shall use their best efforts to settle amicably any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of, or relating to this Contract or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof.

Arbitration

Unless, any such dispute, controversy or claim between the Parties arising out of or relating to this Contract or the breach, termination or invalidity thereof is settled amicably under the preceding paragraph of this Article within sixty (60) days after receipt by one Party of the other Party's request for such amicable settlement, such dispute, controversy or claim shall be referred by either Party.

The arbitral tribunal shall have no authority to award punitive damages. The Parties shall be bound by any arbitration award rendered as a result of such arbitration as the final adjudication of any such controversy, claim or dispute.

15. TAX

The Contractor shall be liable for all taxes arising out of payments made to you pursuant to the Contract.

16. TRAVEL

All air travel will be paid at the economy rate only, unless the Project Supervisor provides written consent to the contrary. Train travel will be paid at the first class rate where this cost does not exceed the cost of an economy air ticket for the same journey.

17. OBSERVANCE OF THE LAW

The Contractor shall comply with all laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations bearing upon the performance of its obligations under the terms of this Contract.

18. PREVENTION OF FRAUD AND CORRUPTION

The Contractor agrees that he/she has read, understands, and commits to, the WWF Fraud & Corruption Policy, and commits to act in a way consistent with WWF International's Code of Ethics and will not engage in fraudulent or corrupt acts. 19. AUTHORITY TO MODIFY

No modification or change in this Contract, no waiver of any of its provisions or any additional contractual relationship of any kind with the Contractor shall be valid and enforceable against WWF unless provided by an amendment to this Contract signed by the authorized official of WWF.



ANNEX III - TERMS OF REFERENCE

FINANCIAL AUDIT OF FINANCIAL AUDIT OF THE MGo956.01 – “YES – Youth Environmental Clubs to mobilize children and communities toward sustainable development in Madagascar”.

1. Background

The Regional Representation of WWF in Madagascar and the West Indian Ocean has received a funding for a total amount of SEK 5,025,000 from SIDA as part of its project "Youth Environmental Clubs to mobilize children and communities – MGo956.01" for the period from January 1, 2012 to December 31, 2012. **Most of funds received is expected to be spent by December 31, 2012 but a carry-over from the funds is allowed within 10 percent of the yearly budget and can be used till February 15, 2012.**

2. Brief description and organization of the project

The project concerns the corridor of humid forest in South-Eastern of Madagascar and the new protected area of Ranobe in the South. In these two landscapes, the biodiversity is threatened by a multitude of factors. Firstly, the population's principal economic activities are charcoal production, and farming using a traditional cultivation technique known as slash-and-burn. Also, especially in the South, the important social and cultural significance of zebu (local cattle), has led to cattle breeding by almost the entire population. The result is extensive overgrazing of the forests, which severely limits the potential for regeneration. Secondly, the demographic pressures of this rural area, have led to the massive destruction of forests and natural species on the brink of extinction. This leads to communities being heavily dependent on their natural resources to provide life sustaining food and livelihoods.

In the humid forest ecoregion, WWF aims to safeguard the ecological integrity of forest landscapes while ensuring the sustainable improvement of living conditions and livelihoods. Furthermore, Madagascar underwent a political and social crisis that rocked the values and priorities of citizens. All forces must be mobilized to transform Malagasy society to acquire the values and the attitudes towards environmental governance and sustainable development.

As part of its Environmental Education Programme, WWF has created a wide movement of young conservation actors at national level, since 1992. These environmental clubs are called "Vintsy clubs" and are established in schools, public and private elementary and secondary and within the university. 700 clubs with more than 50,000 young members from 5 to 21 years are currently active at national level. 25 clubs are established around



the moist forest Corridor and 10 around the NPA of Ranobe. Despite their major achievements in terms of behavior change, Vintsy clubs are not really connected with environmental actors that they will have to take over. In its Conservation Plan, WWF seeks a broader commitment to value the potential and achievements of these young people, by enhancing their direct contribution in the conservation of biodiversity related initiatives undertaken by the local community.

The project is part of a long term initiative of strengthening capacities of CSOs in Madagascar to engage in decision making at local, regional and national levels. WWF has successfully been building the capacity of the civil society by supporting CBOs and networks. However the youths have not been involved nor has it addressed the increasing important challenge of children's and youth's lack of education and health. Based on WWF MWIOPPO experience in environmental education (EE), WWF needs to highlight more on education for sustainable development (ESD). Through the Education for Sustainable Development approach, the project will work towards strengthening the capacity of youth environmental clubs and network to become champions in voicing for their rights and needs and in mobilizing positive changes within their communities. In fact, YES (Youth Environmental clubS) is both a philosophy and a way forward by which young people say "Yes! We are ready together to go ahead for a more sustainable and equitable world".

Rights for education and health are major issues for children and youth in this landscape, so our strategy is oriented to enhance this situation and also to seek link this with environmental considerations as their livelihoods largely depends upon natural resources. Members of clubs will have to mentor other out-of-school young people in their community; by doing so, the project contributes to improve the situation of education through a non-formal programme, and at the same time will contribute to reinforce the emerging civil society in Madagascar through youth environmental clubs by allowing them to create networks and give them opportunities to voice their rights and concerns at local, regional and national levels.

Then, the project aims to support the establishment of a network of clubs Vintsy to break their isolation, to unite in all its diversity and to strengthen their efforts to preserve the moist forest corridor in the southern east and the new protected area of Ranobe in the South. These networks will have the advantage of supporting the motivation of clubs around a common vision and sense of belonging to a geographically broader movement. Indeed, the network will connect various municipalities clubs inside and near the corridor with clubs in urban areas and with clubs Vintsy of older and more experienced established within the University of Fianarantsoa and Toliara.



The stated goals and objectives for this project are as follows:

Goal: Youth environmental clubs are recognized and acknowledged to participate in emerging environmental civil society networks in order to ensure their voice, rights and concerns are represented locally, regionally and nationally.

Objectives:

- By the end of 2012, environmental clubs in the PK32-Ranobe landscape and in the Fandriana Vondrozo Midongy humid forests corridor (COFAV) are reinforced to have the necessary knowledge, skills and values to promote positive health and environmental changes within their communities throughout-of-school children and young people.
- By the end of 2012, networks of environmental clubs in the South West of Madagascar and in the humid forest corridor (COFAV) region are in place and armed to raise awareness, and mobilize youth movements to voice their rights and concerns regarding environmental issues affecting their lives.

Major activities:

- 1) Support the extension of Vintsy clubs to all communes of the two landscapes;
- 2) Strengthening of Vintsy clubs inside the two landscapes ;
- 3) Support the implementation of concrete fun activities linking conservation and development initiatives to ensuring knowledge and skills through learning by doing for their future employment and for discovering biodiversity values, and to opening door for children and young people unscholarized;
- 4) Network environmental clubs in Southern West and Eastern regions and reinforce their capacity to assume their roles and responsibilities as civil society organization ;
- 5) Improve access to information by setting up CAP (learning and sharing centre) within CCEE to open permanent space for young and by editing Vintsy Magazine and by connecting the network to other CSO at all level even internationally ;
- 6) Support the two networks to raise awareness and create youth movement by organizing forum, debate, events and participation to national and regional exchange visit ;
- 7) Connect the 2 networks with other regional, national and international youth movements and support their participation in the Pan African Youth event.

All of the documents supporting all transactions are available in Antananarivo and in Toliary offices. The WWF office in Antananarivo is responsible for the consolidation of accounts, the preparation and submission of financial report.
