



Corporate Tiger Declaration

The Year of the Tiger, anchored in the Chinese lunar calendar, began on February 14, 2010. Whereas 100 years ago there were an estimated 100,000 tigers, today there are fewer than 3,200. Since the last Year of the Tiger in 1998, tigers have lost 40% of their habitat and today occupy only 7 percent of their historic range.

This year, all 13 tiger range countries -- Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, Russia, Thailand, Vietnam – and the wider tiger conservation community have adopted the laudable goal of doubling the population of wild tigers by 2022, the next Year of the Tiger. The leaders of these countries convened at a Tiger Summit in Russia in November to formally adopt a Leaders' Declaration committing their countries to doubling their tiger populations and taking the steps necessary to do so.

Recognizing the role that industry also plays in minimizing threats to tigers and their habitats, we, the undersigned companies:

- Reiterate our belief in the power of responsible sourcing of natural resources to conserve the world's valuable and threatened forests and the people and wildlife that depend on them.
- Support national actions by tiger range countries to promote the conservation of tiger landscapes, reduce demand for illegal tiger trade, minimize human-tiger conflict and collaborate regionally for effective action;
- Strive, through our business practices, to avoid or minimize, impacts of our natural resource sourcing on tiger habitat, by implementing responsible purchasing policies and, where possible, to improve landscapes for wild tiger populations; and
- Call upon other companies in our sector to also ensure that current and future procurement decisions will protect these vital tiger habitats.
